TOPIC:	Draft Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023
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BACKGROUND:	Based on the Council's direction during the May 24, 2022 and June 21, 2022 Budget Workshops, the Draft Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 includes the following:
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Revenues

- The use of the current property tax rate of \$0.4150 and the low end of HCAD's Projected 2022 Taxable Value Range.
- For Sales Tax Revenues and all Municipal Court-related Revenues, the proposed budgeted amount was calculated using an average of the 3 previous fiscal years' actuals plus the current fiscal year's projections.
- A General Fund projected deficit of approximately \$445,177 to be offset by Audited FY 2021 Excess Revenues.
- As we discussed during the Budget Workshop meeting on June 21, 2022, during the FY 2022 budget development, the City had estimated revenues over expenditures for FY 2021 to be approximately \$396,295 and, during the fiscal year close out (Budget Amendment 2), the City's estimated revenues over expenditures for FY 2021 would increase to \$664,136. Once the FY 2021 audit was complete, the final revenues over expenditures increased again to \$745,887.

The City's FY 2022 Adopted General Fund Budget included an anticipated deficit of revenues of approximately \$306,715. After extensive discussion, the City Council made a conscious decision to fund the anticipated deficit in the General Fund with projected excess revenues from FY 2021 instead of sweeping the excess revenues back into the General Fund Fund Balance.

The audited excess revenues of \$745,887 from FY 2021 is approximately 88% higher than the originally estimated revenues over expenditures of \$396,295 and will fully fund each of the draft Fiscal Year 2023 budget scenarios.

As discussed during the June 21, 2022 Budget Workshop, as of May, based on actual revenues and expenditures, City Treasurer Michelle Yi is projecting excess revenues for Fiscal Year 2022 of approximately \$387,748 instead of a deficit of \$306,715 as projected during the FY 2022 budget process. So it is not necessary to use FY 2021 excess revenues over expenditures for

this funding.

Expenditures/Expenses

- A 7% cost-of-living (COLA) salary increase for all Departments. As directed, Summary FY 2022-2023 Budget Spreadsheets using an 8% COLA and a 9% COLA have also been included.
- The approved increased amounts for Village Fire Department.
- CPI adjustment for some services are built-in to the proposed budget such as Garbage Collection, IT support, and Equipment maintenance.
- Three Unfunded Supplement Requests (USR) from the Police Department for (1) two additional Police Officers; (2) a new 5-year lease for the Department's tasers and (3) 6 ballistic shields, copies of which are provided with this agenda item.
 - USR (1): The total annual salary and benefits for two additional Police Officers is \$209,104, and \$33,666 will be offset by the contribution from the City of Hilshire Village. So, the net cost for the first year of this request will be \$175,438.00.
 - USR (2): The total cost of a new 5-year lease for the Department's tasers is \$95,945, and each year's leasing cost is \$19,189. This cost will be offset by the contribution from City of Hilshire Village each year in the amount \$3,089.42. So, the net cost for each year is \$16,100.
 - USR (3): The total cost for the requested 6 ballistic shields is estimated to be \$39,000. I talked with Commissioner Dixon on July 12, 2022, about funding the ballistic shields with the Spring Valley Legacy Fund, and he thought it was a good idea. The current available funding balance in SVLF is \$76,764.75.
- As requested by Council during the May 24, 2022 Budget Workshop, we calculated how the 7%, 8% and 9% COLA options would impact the proposed salary market adjustments to bring all positions into the market based on years of experience in the position ("TIP"). Below is the summary of each cost option based on the different options for COLA. This information is also provided separately in the supporting documentation.

Based on current salaries (less the salaries for the 5 positions that Council already approved bringing to the minimum), the total cost to bring 23 positions to TIP would be \$330,030.

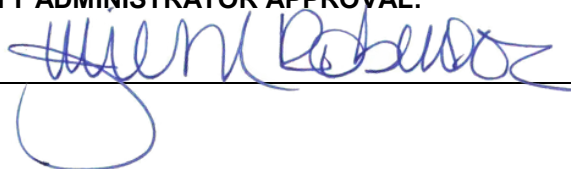
- If the 7% COLA option were implemented, 7 of the 23 positions would be at the proposed market adjustment salary, and the total cost to bring the remaining 16 positions to TIP would be reduced to \$215,395.
- If the 8% COLA option were implemented, the 16 positions that are not at the proposed market adjustment salary would make progress in moving towards the proposed market adjustment salary, and the total cost to bring those positions to TIP would be reduced to \$201,669.
- If the 9% COLA option were implemented, 2 more positions would be at the proposed market adjustment salary, and the total cost to bring the remaining 14 positions to TIP would be reduced to \$189,012. At this point, 18 of the original 23 positions would be at the proposed market adjustment salary.

None of these TIP options have been built into the proposed FY 2023 budget.

City Treasurer Michelle Yi and I have reviewed the individual line items of the Draft Budget, discussed the budget numbers submitted by the different Departments with the Department Directors as needed, and made adjustments based on actuals for FY 2023 as well as the budget numbers submitted by the Departments.

Harris County Appraisal District is expected to deliver the City's Certified Estimate of Taxable Value to us early next week. Hopefully we will have it by the Council Workshop. Once we receive the Certified Estimate, we will receive the 2022 Truth-In-Taxation Tax Rates from the Tax Assessor/Collector. We will then know how the current tax rate of \$0.4150 compares to those tax rates. **As a reminder, there is a Special Council Meeting scheduled for Tuesday, August 2, 2022 at 6:00 pm for the Council to formally propose a property tax rate for FY 2023.**

TOPIC:	Proposing A Tax Rate Of \$0.4150 Per \$100 Valuation For The Fiscal Year Beginning October 1, 2022, And Ending September 30, 2023.
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BACKGROUND:	As discussed during the Budget Workshops last year, Senate Bill 2 (Texas Property Tax Reform and Transparency Act of 2019) changed the names of the previous Truth-In-Taxation ("TNT") tax rates and created a new tax rate.
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- The No-New-Revenue Rate (NNR) is the tax rate that would produce the same amount of taxes (no new taxes) if applied to the same properties that are taxed in both years. This was previously the Effective Tax Rate.
- The Voter-Approval Rate (VAR) is the highest tax rate that a taxing unit may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate. The VAR was reduced from 8% to 3.5% for most cities; however, there was also a provision for cities to calculate the VAR at 8% in the event of a disaster. This was previously the Rollback Tax Rate. Last year, the City's direction to the City's Tax Assessor/Collector was to utilize the 3.5% for calculation of the VAR, and this direction remained the same for this year.
- The new tax rate created by Senate Bill 2 is the De Minimis Rate (DMR). The DMR was designed and added to allow smaller cities (those with a population of less than 30,000) some flexibility to adopt a tax rate that generates \$500,000 more in property tax revenue than the previous year. The thinking was that applying a 3.5% VAR in some very small communities would unnecessarily restrict revenue growth to sometimes just a nominal amount, and the application of the lowered voter-approval rate created an unfair result for small cities. The cities to which the DMR applies must calculate the DMR regardless of whether they intend to utilize it.

Comparison of Proposed FY 2023 Tax Rate to Calculated TNT FY 2022 Tax Rates

The City Council is anticipated to propose a tax rate of \$0.4150 for Fiscal Year 2023 (same as current tax rate), and the FY 2023 Proposed Budget has been developed using the anticipated Proposed Tax Rate. Based on the Truth-In-Taxation Worksheets provided by the Tax Assessor/Collector, the Proposed FY 2023 Tax Rate is slightly under the NNR Tax Rate.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends proposing a tax rate of \$0.4150 per \$100 Valuation for the Fiscal Year Beginning October 1, 2022 and ending September 30, 2023.

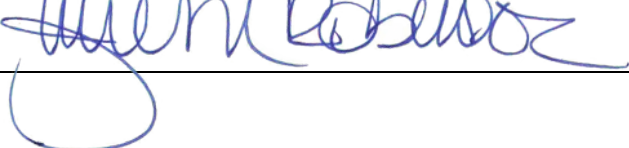

Dear Mayor Vajdos:

As required by Texas Tax Code Sec. 26.01(a-1), we have prepared an estimate of taxable value for the above taxing jurisdiction for 2022.

While we have taken our best estimate of potential hearing loss into account, 2022 protests are still being received and formal hearings held during the next several months may cause further value reductions. Also, if fewer protests are filed, your value could possibly increase.

Your final taxable value will also be impacted by late-filed exemption applications, late applications for productivity valuation, correction motions under Tax Code Sec. 25.25, immediate residential homestead exemptions granted pursuant to Tax Code Sec. 11.42(f), and possible post-ARB appeals through binding arbitration, appeals to district court, or appeals to the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

Given these limitations, the estimated 2022 taxable value for the taxing unit identified above is:

\$1,492,170,456

The enclosed worksheet also provides additional estimated values that may be useful in your tax rate calculations.

GENERAL INFORMATION: Tax Code Section 26.04(c) requires an officer or employee designated by the governing body to calculate the no-new-revenue (NNR) tax rate and voter-approval tax rate for the taxing unit. These tax rates are expressed in dollars per \$100 of taxable value calculated. The calculation process starts after the chief appraiser delivers to the taxing unit the certified appraisal roll and the estimated values of properties under protest. The designated officer or employee shall certify that the officer or employee has accurately calculated the tax rates and used values shown for the certified appraisal roll or certified estimate. The officer or employee submits the rates to the governing body by Aug. 7 or as soon thereafter as practicable.

School districts do not use this form, but instead use Comptroller Form 50-859 *Tax Rate Calculation Worksheet, School District without Chapter 313 Agreements* or Comptroller Form 50-884 *Tax Rate Calculation Worksheet, School District with Chapter 313 Agreements*.

Water districts as defined under Water Code Section 49.001(1) do not use this form, but instead use Comptroller Form 50-858 *Water District Voter-Approval Tax Rate Worksheet for Low Tax Rate and Developing Districts* or Comptroller Form 50-860 *Developed Water District Voter-Approval Tax Rate Worksheet*.

The Comptroller's office provides this worksheet to assist taxing units in determining tax rates. The information provided in this worksheet is offered as technical assistance and not legal advice. Taxing units should consult legal counsel for interpretations of law regarding tax rate preparation and adoption.

SECTION 1: No-New-Revenue Tax Rate

The NNR tax rate enables the public to evaluate the relationship between taxes for the prior year and for the current year based on a tax rate that would produce the same amount of taxes (no new taxes) if applied to the same properties that are taxed in both years. When appraisal values increase, the NNR tax rate should decrease.

The NNR tax rate for a county is the sum of the NNR tax rates calculated for each type of tax the county levies.

While uncommon, it is possible for a taxing unit to provide an exemption for only maintenance and operations taxes. In this case, the taxing unit will need to calculate the NNR tax rate separately for the maintenance and operations tax and the debt tax, then add the two components together.

SECTION 2: Voter-Approval Tax Rate

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that a taxing unit may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate. The voter-approval tax rate is split into two separate rates:

- Maintenance and Operations (M&O) Tax Rate:** The M&O portion is the tax rate that is needed to raise the same amount of taxes that the taxing unit levied in the prior year plus the applicable percentage allowed by law. This rate accounts for such things as salaries, utilities and day-to-day operations.
- Debt Rate:** The debt rate includes the debt service necessary to pay the taxing unit's debt payments in the coming year. This rate accounts for principal and interest on bonds and other debt secured by property tax revenue.

The voter-approval tax rate for a county is the sum of the voter-approval tax rates calculated for each type of tax the county levies. In most cases the voter-approval tax rate exceeds the no-new-revenue tax rate, but occasionally decreases in a taxing unit's debt service will cause the NNR tax rate to be higher than the voter-approval tax rate.

A taxing unit may raise its rate for M&O funds used to pay for a facility, device or method for the control of air, water or land pollution. This includes any land, structure, building, installation, excavation, machinery, equipment or device that is used, constructed, acquired or installed wholly or partly to meet or exceed pollution control requirements. SECTION 5: Voter-Approval Tax Rate Adjustment for Unused Increment Rate

The unused increment rate is the rate equal to the difference between the adopted tax rate and voter-approval tax rate before the unused increment rate for the prior three years.³⁹ In a year where a taxing unit adopts a rate by applying any portion of the unused increment rate, the unused increment rate for that year would be zero.

The difference between the adopted tax rate and voter-approval tax rate is considered zero in the following scenarios:

- a tax year before 2020;⁴⁰
- a tax year in which the municipality is a defunding municipality, as defined by Tax Code Section 26.0501(a);⁴¹ or
- after Jan. 1, 2022, a tax year in which the comptroller determines that the county implemented a budget reduction or reallocation described by Local Government Code Section 120.002(a) without the required voter approval.⁴²

SECTION 7: Voter-Approval Tax Rate Adjustment for Emergency Revenue Rate

In the tax year after the end of the disaster calculation time period detailed in Tax Code Section 26.042(a), a taxing unit that calculated its voter-approval tax rate in the manner provided for a special taxing unit due to a disaster must calculate its emergency revenue rate and reduce its voter-approval tax rate for that year.⁴⁶

Similarly, if a taxing unit adopted a tax rate that exceeded its voter-approval tax rate, calculated normally, without holding an election to respond to a disaster, as allowed by Tax Code Section 26.042(d), in the prior year, it must also reduce its voter-approval tax rate for the current tax year.⁴⁷

This section will apply to a taxing unit other than a special taxing unit that:

- directed the designated officer or employee to calculate the voter-approval tax rate of the taxing unit in the manner provided for a special taxing unit in the prior year; and
- the current year is the first tax year in which the total taxable value of property taxable by the taxing unit as shown on the appraisal roll for the taxing unit submitted by the assessor for the taxing unit to the governing body exceeds the total taxable value of property taxable by the taxing unit on January 1 of the tax year in which the disaster occurred or the disaster occurred four years ago.
